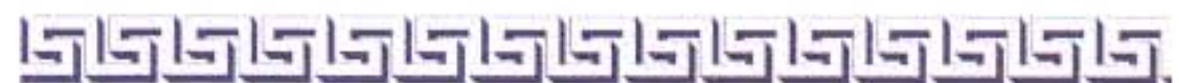

## Research

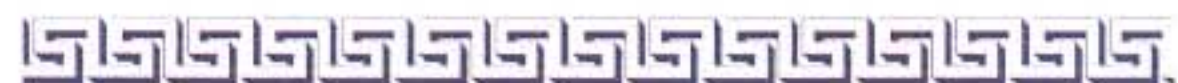

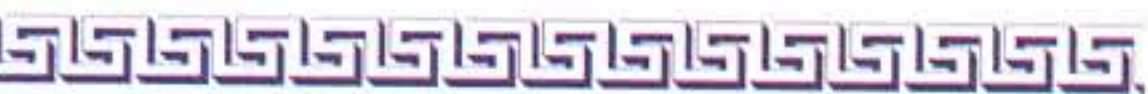
